

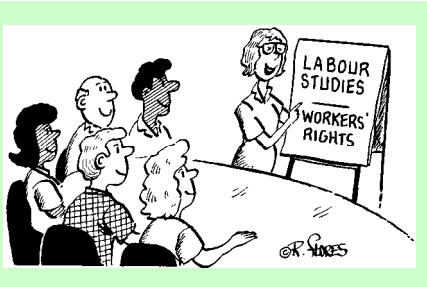

# NUPGE Atlantic Week-long School

St. Francis Xavier University - Antigonish, N.S.

June 7 - 12, 2009

The Union's Education and Occupational Health and Safety Committee is accepting applications from members interested in participating in this year's NUPGE Atlantic week-long school. The following courses are being offered this year:

**Advanced Steward Training** - This course develops the knowledge and skills of stewards. It covers concepts like duty to accommodate, just cause, and the duty of fair representation. It also helps to develop techniques for investigating grievances, meetings with management, problem solving, as well as workplace leadership and education.

**Communications** - This course is designed to help activists and leaders improve their public speaking skills. It will cover concepts like messaging and framing, the speaking voice, presentation skills, and skill building. Skill building will include crafting the message, talking to the media, and talking on camera. Participants will be expected to make presentations and speak on camera during this course.

**Organizing and Mobilizing** - This course focuses on aspects of organizing the unorganized. It will look at areas like legal requirements, trust building, visiting potential new members, card signing, and building a movement. The course will also help participants develop skills to organize and mobilize the membership for workplace and public campaigns on behalf of the union.

**Leadership** - Participants in this course will develop skills necessary for today's leaders in the labour movement. Critical issues facing the labour movement will be reviewed while focusing on skills such as strategic planning, team building, decision making, and critical analysis.
